WESLEY TOWER NEWS

As of March 14, 2005, the roll down fire door is being installed over the John Wesley window. The elevator is finished except for some details, such as the installation of the call buttons, which have to wait until the wall covering is completed. Work on the interior walls should be in progress now, as well as the exterior wall covering. The two stained glass windows that were removed from the old entrance lobby are being refurbished and will be installed in the new lobby opposite the elevator door. The design for the new round stained glass window above the main door has been approved and the window is in production.

Changes in the main building are progressing rapidly. New carpet, floor coverings, and cove moldings have been selected by our color experts. Work on the new hood over the stove in the kitchen has been delayed because new drawings must be approved before the hood and duct work can be fabricated. The installation looks like it will happen sometime in April. Since the hood is being treated as a separate project, it will hold up the application for an occupancy permit for the tower.

NOTES FROM THE CAP STAFF

A reminder about CAP's hours: The thrift shop and food closet are open Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.; Thursday from Noon to 6:00 p.m.; and Friday from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. We invite you to visit during these hours to look for bargains in our cheery shop or to drop off items for re-sale. We especially seek donations of children's clothes, toys, knick knacks, dishes, glassware, and other small household items. Your donations are tax-deductible, if you itemize. If you come on a Friday, you can chat with Lillian Simmons and Ruth Taylor – we send our thanks to these faithful volunteers for taking the Friday shift these many years.

We need "substitute" volunteers for the thrift shop. Please call and add your name to the list of people who can help from time to time if a regular volunteer is ill.

If you are low income and low on food, please visit CAP's food closet. Walk-ins are welcome -- you do not need a referral. If you need transportation home, we can give you a bus pass. In February 2005, the food closet served 118 adults and 63 children; in January 170 adults and 77 children. Through a connection with Stroehmann's Bakery, CAP now has an unlimited supply of fresh bread for low income people. You may pick up bread at CAP, or call for delivery if you need that service.

Emergency Funds: CAP continues to disburse \$2,000 per month to assist with rent, utilities, and medicine.

Special thanks to Five Points Fire Company. The firefighters donated funds that CAP used to purchase beds for a deserving family. One of the firefighters also donated a new mountain bike which was sold the next day in the thrift shop.
