#### Saturday, December 10 - 9:00 a.m.



## Richardson Park Community Action Program



### November 2005

**Crisis Alleviation:** In the month of October, CAP distributed \$2,000 in crisis alleviation funds. Of this total, \$600 went to help our clients with rent, and the balance to help them with utility bills. The food closet served 67 households, representing 92 adults and 44 children.

**Foot Clinic:** Podiatrist Dr. Gina Freeman continues to see six to eight patients per month. She comes to CAP the third Monday of every month, at 1:00 pm. Dr. Freeman charges a fee, and her services are open to everyone. Please call Mary Jane if you would like to become a new patient.

**Hope Clubs:** Only because of the loyal support of the Koinonia class, CAP continues to serve an average of 22 households per month with this sustaining food distribution program.

**United Way of Delaware:** If you give to United Way at your office, you can designate CAP as the recipient of your gift. CAP's Agency Code number is 9414. You simply need to insert this number on your pledge form, and your donations will come right to CAP. (Note that the correct Agency Code is 9414. We had given you an incorrect number in the last Messenger.)
