<u>Pastor's</u> Ponderings

"Soar we now where Christ has led, Alleluia! Following our exalted head, Alleluia! Made like him, like him we rise, Alleluia! Ours the cross, the grave, the skies, Alleluia!" Christ the Lord Is Risen Today

I can close my eyes and still hear the echo of the joyous music of Easter reverberate through the sanctuary. I can feel the energy and excitement that always fills the church on Easter Day. A wonderful crowd of people comes through the doors to worship together and experience once again the joy that is Easter. And then...

Often there is quite a let-down the following week. The next Sunday is sometimes jokingly referred to as "Low Sunday." Attendance plummets, excitement dissipates, energy is at a low ebb. When I was serving as an Associate Pastor, my fellow associates and I often joked about "Universal Associate Pastors Preaching Day." All of our Senior Pastors had headed for the hills, nowhere to be found, drained by all the activities leading up to Easter. Who can blame them? I'm sure choir members and all those actively involved in the life of the church might like to do the same thing!

The Sunday After Easter...Wait!...Scratch that!...I made a mistake!...The Second Sunday of Easter, (doesn't that sound better) has come. Calling that particular Sunday by a different name is not just a matter of semantics, it's a reminder, and it's an important theological statement. For as Larry Stookey reminds us, The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is far too momentous an occasion and much too central to the life of the church and to our identity as Christians for the celebration to be confined to a single day. We have entered the Season of Easter!

In the weeks ahead, we will continue to hear the stories of how people encountered the Living Christ

and we will continue to sing the joyous music of Easter. The crowds that filled the church on Easter Day may not all be here, but the Living Christ continues to walk with us. While our energy level may be a bit low and our excitement somewhat diminished for good reason, a little reorientation never hurt.

Easter Day may have passed, but Easter is far from over. Dr. Stookey writes: "Easter Day is the opening of a protracted celebration, even as the Resurrection is itself the opening to a vast new reality." Perhaps we need to focus a bit less on what we do and a bit more on what God has done.

The Great Fifty Days of Easter are upon us. The season will come to a marvelous crescendo on June 4, the Day of Pentecost. Through all of these days, and through the highs and the lows, may we experience the presence of the Risen and Living Christ with us and among us. May we raise our hearts and our voices in praise as we celebrate the wondrous thing that God has done. For the Lord is risen indeed! Alleluia!



These articles are intended to provide insight about many contributions from our church family.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Finance Committee compiles an annual budget which is brought to Church Council for approval, tracks receipts and disbursements, recommends investments for church funds, and literally pays the bills! These functions require diligent, ongoing commitment by a team of church members. Church treasurer Joe Tucker, assistant treasurer and financial secretary Sandy Swain, and financial secretary Janet Dickerson make up the administrative core of this group. Other members of the Finance Committee currently are Rob Anderson, Herb Atkinson, Byrom Price, and Joan Stadelman and by virtue of office Phyllis Thomas, Ed Ide, and Pastor Bill Green. The Finance Committee, as a whole, meets on an "as needed" basis. Most of the tasks of the committee, however, occur on a regular basis.

Each Sunday after worship service, several volunteers sort the contributions from the day's offering and place them in the church safe. The next day, a three-person team counts the money, records each individual contribution and makes a bank deposit of the total offering. These functions are performed by two alternating groups: Barbara Sayles, Earle and Shirl Snapp and Sandy Swain, Pat Cummings, and Janet Dickerson. Each month Sandy Swain or Joe Tucker, church treasurers, pays the bills and Janet enters the financial data into the contribution and financial spreadsheets. Monthly, Joe and Sandy prepare a financial statement and bring it to the Church Council for review and discussion. This multi-page financial statement lists all the sources of receipts and disbursements as well as summarizes the money held in various accounts and investments. Income lines reflect the current month's data and compare year-to-date income in the current year to the prior year, along with percentage of change. Disbursements are listed for the month, year-to-date, and percentage change to the budgeted amount. Are you confused yet? Thank goodness Joe has an accounting background, and Sandy and Janet are dedicated to keeping track of the details. What would we do without them?

The church's expenditures include salaries, benefits, local church ministry (such as educational materials, Vacation Bible School, and evangelism), conference ministries, church and parsonage utilities, mission donations, and building maintenance and repair. Within the conference ministries are "apportionments," our monetary obligation to the Peninsula-Delaware Conference which covers world mission projects and administrative costs. (Recall the first article of this series listed the local mission projects which are paid through fund-raising efforts of RPUMC Missions Committee.)

Each fall, the Finance Committee asks committee chairpersons and other individuals to submit their budget requests for the upcoming year. For example, the Education Committee would determine the amount needed for purchase of educational materials for the next year. After receipt of the data, the Finance Committee meets to compile a budget which reflects the amounts requested. The Church Council considers the budget and determines its final form.

On an annual basis, an independent audit of the church's finances is performed. Ed Locke has functioned as church auditor for many years. Harold Ritter now assists Ed in the auditing function.

The details above may make you dizzy, but they are intended to provide a sense of the complexity of running the finances of this little church with a BIG heart.

Kudos to the Finance Committee, volunteers who help sort and count the money, and the auditors. We appreciate your many hours of service and dedication to the church.


