In 2006, your contributions added up to \$84.00! Thanks to everyone who participated. Your continued support is greatly appreciated.


RPUMC'S 100 ANNIVERSARY

MUSIC NOTES

Terri Weaver, Director

Dietrich Buxtehude (1637-1707)

Not officially documented, but Dietrich Buxtehude may have been born in Denmark where his father was the organist. (But, he was considered a German composer!) He followed in his father's footsteps in various organist positions previously held by his father. He moved to Germany in 1660 where he took a prestigious position for a German congregation in Lubeck, Germany. He married the outgoing organist's daughter, which may have been a condition of employment. (Oh wow!!!)

His official duties (besides all of the music/organ) included treasurer, secretary and business manager for the church. He wrote Sonatas, Chamber music, vocal and organ music. He is most famous for his concerts, *Abendmusik*, held in the afternoon after five Sunday services and special occasions. (Sounds like the beginning of cantatas?) These concerts were described as extraordinary and were the basis for his fame. J.S. Bach (1685-1750) once traveled over 200 miles to hear one of his concerts and stayed for three months. Buxtehude thus inspired the young Bach while he studied with him. Just like Bach, Buxtehude did not become famous until 100 years after his death.

In 1703 Buxtehude had a chance to retire. Georg Friedrick Handle and Johann Matheson visited with him as possible candidates. Matheson considered but later balked because he was required to marry Buxtehude's daughter. After Buxtehude died in May 1707, another organist agreed to marry her and was Buxtehude's replacement. (Things really have changed in the organ world!!)

As a board member of the Delaware AGO (American Guild of Organists), we sponsor various workshops and recitals performed by AGO members. I invite you all to a "member recital" scheduled in March 2007 featuring music of a Baroque composer named Dietrich Buxtehude. 2007 marks the 300th anniversary of a composer's life who influenced much of J.S. Bach's music. I plan to feature some of Buxtehude's music in February as my Preludes and Postludes. (Details of the concert to follow next month.)
