RICHARDSON PARK U.M.C. CELEBRATES 100 YEARS OF MINISTRY

1907 was a long time ago. In 1907, Theodore Roosevelt was President of the United States. That same year, a guy named Hoover invented the vacuum cleaner. In 1907, Henry Ford was busy developing the Model T which would roll off the assembly line one year later. You could buy one for \$825. In 1907, Lewis B. During the period July 1, 2006 through December 31, 2006, CAP received and distributed 23,616 pounds of food. During this period, the Food Closet served 569 adults and 477 children. Sources of food are Food Bank of Delaware, church and community donations, and Stroehmann's Bakery.
