"If you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any fellowship with the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and purpose."

- Philippians 2:1-2 (New International Version)

I love this time of year! Even though the days are still a bit too short and the coming of Lent means that I will be fasting, this is the season that I feel most connected to God and God's work in the world. It's an amazing time when we daily seek to repent of our ways and walk a bit closer to the path that God has called us to through the example of Jesus Christ. It's something that I wouldn't miss for the world. For I believe the high holy days of the Christian year begin with Ash Wednesday and end on Easter Sunday. This is what being a Christian is all about, because Lent is about seeking God.

For those of you wondering how I could get so "pumped up" over Lent, let me give you a bit of background: Lent is a forty-day period, excluding Sundays, during which we Christians prepare ourselves spiritually for the commemoration of Christ's suffering, death and resurrection. Beginning in the second century, Christians would undergo a brief period of fasting and prayer in preparation for Good Friday and Easter. By the fourth century the period had been extended to forty days to coincide with the forty days that Jesus fasted and prayed in the wilderness at the beginning of his ministry (which also coincided with the forty days Moses and Elijah fasted in the Old Testament). The season was originally called "the forty days" but later came to be called Lent - from the Old English, *lengten*, a reference to the lengthening of the days that happens in the springtime. Lent was also the season when Christian converts made their final preparation for receiving their baptism and first communion at the Easter vigil. It was a time of repentance for those who had abandoned the faith during the persecutions. Lent calls us to more intense and intentional spiritual growth during which we remember the message, the life, the suffering and death of Christ.

I hope that you will share my joy and enthusiasm about developing a relationship with our living Lord, Jesus Christ, and so I'm inviting you to do three things this Lent: (1) Be in worship every weekend, (2) Read your Bible daily - I'll be handing out a Lenten reading guide during worship starting on Ash Wednesday, and (3) Fast something as an expression of your faith and identification with Jesus' suffering. I will usually fast from food for one day a week, and also try to give up one of my "comfort foods" like chocolate or soda. Through these spiritual disciplines we, in a small way, share in the journey of Christ from the Hosannas of Palm Sunday, up the Via De la Rosa to Golgotha, onto the Cross, and finally arriving at the empty tomb. Join me in forty days of getting closer to Jesus and closer to God.

May this Lenten season renew your desire and passion for God,
