**Future Projects and Maintenance of the  
Church Grounds**

It is very important for the well being of the church for all who are able to step forward when projects and maintenance items need attention. With funds being limited, we cannot afford to hire contractors to perform all of the repairs and maintenance that it takes to keep a facility like ours operational. And we cannot put the burden solely on the Building Maintenance Group (BMG) or the Trustees.

In most cases, you will find that when projects need to be done around the church grounds it would only require a few hours of your time, especially if multiple people are willing to help and utilize their skills and talents.

One project that comes to mind is the maintenance and care of the hedges on the church grounds. I would like to form a team of individuals to trim the hedges and to weed.

In the beginning of the summer season, one of the members of our church donated the funds to hire a contractor to have the hedges trimmed, weeded and mulched. The hedges should only need to be trimmed and weeded a few times during the summer period. ## **DOWN MEMORY LANE**

**Article by Ella de Courcelle**

I would like to share a bit of two interesting letters I received from an RPUMC member (Esther McDowell) who resides in Florida. There is some wonderful history, AND a rather amazing personal connection.

The first letter was given to me by Mary Alice Bair:

“I was reading about Ella de Courcelle and I just couldn’t believe it. Anne and Joe de Courcelle lived next door to my sister (Ruth Sidwell Hirsch) and her husband Fred Hirsch in Woodcrest. ...Ella was just a little girl at Woodcrest and she would come over from next door to play with my nieces.” [The de Courcelle’s originally lived on Belmont Ave., here in Richardson Park and later moved to Woodcrest.]

The second letter came directly to me:

“I am 86 years old and still have my brain...I really don’t know where to start, so will start with 1907—the year my father and mother were married. They lived on DuPont Road and my father had the first grocery store in Richardson Park.

My uncle A. K. Taylor made the blocks and he and his men built the first Richardson Park church at the corner of Glenrich and Eureka Sts. He later gave the land where the present church stands...My uncle owned a farm called the Richardson farm and he was a builder and real estate man. He had a large well and pumped water to various houses he built—thus Artesian Water Co. began and developed Richardson Park.

I live here at Banyan Place—an independent building of apartments... I too attended Conrad, as did Ruthie and she became secretary in the office of Conrad until she got married. I didn’t get married until I was 54...started my career at age 38 at the old Memorial Hospital in Wilmington.

As I sat daily for several weeks and watched my 86 year old aunt slip away, I became acquainted with the nurses and I knew that was where I wanted to work. I applied for the job as Unit Clerk at the Nurses’ Station in 1962 June and finally there was an opening in October...I always drove down to Richardson Park church on Sundays that I had off.

I don’t know many people in RP Church now—always read the monthly bulletin to see if I know anyone.

I went to Conrad with Anna Mae Shewbrooks, Bob Ashton, Johnson Bair, Branson Fry, Kenneth Varell, all the Thomas family, Ruth Gibney...

I must brag a little. After working at the hospital for 15 years in 1978 before I retired I was chosen Employee of the Year from 4000 employees from 3 divisions. When I started there in 1962 I didn’t know a bed sheet from a sheet of paper.”

Down in what used to be the pine and oak covered boondocks, south of Dover in Kent County, there still stands an old two-story brick building of extremely simple design that means more to American Methodism than any of the million-dollar, classic Gothic Methodist temples in the nation.

It's known as Barratt's Chapel and is not too far from the village of Johnny Cake Landing, now called Frederica.

The chapel was built in 1780 as a place of worship for people then sneered at as "those new-fangled enthusiasts called Methodists."

The chapel means so much to American Methodism because the foundation of present-day American Methodism was laid there by two pioneers of the faith 200 years ago. They were Francis Asbury and Thomas Coke, who had been sent to America from England by John Wesley to organize the various Methodist groups into one union.

Asbury, who was an itinerant Methodist preacher throughout the Delmarva Peninsula, met Coke in Barratt's Chapel late in November of 1784. They held their organizational meeting in Lovely Lane Church, Baltimore, on Christmas Eve of 1784.

In 1911, Judge Norris Barratt of Philadelphia, a descendant of the man for whom the chapel was named, told the Historical Society of Delaware. "What Mount Sinai was to the ancient Jew, Mecca to the true Mohammedan and Independence Hall to the patriotic American, Barratt's chapel is to the Methodist, the cradle of his faith – a shrine."

Philip Barratt Jr., born in 1730, was the son of a prosperous Kent County landowner and farmer. He had been a member of the Anglican Church, but became a devout supporter of Francis Asbury, the leading Methodist preacher in Delaware in the 1770's and 1780's.

Barratt, who owned considerable land in the vicinity of Johnny Cake Landing, decided to donate several acres for a chapel and a burial ground, on condition that only Methodists would preach from its pulpit and the cemetery be reserved for Methodists.

He also donated sufficient funds for the construction of the chapel and saw to it that its architecture was simple. The brick had been imported from Holland and the wooden interior, benches and pulpit were fashioned from trees in the forest on the chapel's site.

The chapel was opened for worship in 1780. It quickly became known as "Barratt's Chapel."

In the meantime, Barratt became involved in Kent County politics and was elected sheriff of the county during the American Revolutionary War. He was also elected to the General Assembly.

He would have been thrilled to have witnessed the meeting of Asbury and Coke in the chapel in November 1784, but unfortunately he died several weeks before at the age of 54.

Asbury later referred to him as "that holy man in life and death."

However, there were many landowners in Kent County who were not fond of Barratt, chiefly because, along with other Methodists, he had freed all his slaves.

By 1900 when the Methodists were not as historically minded as they are today, interest in the chapel as a historic site dwindled. By 1911, the chapel was sadly neglected, and was doomed to be forgotten.

But fortunately, there was a minister, the Rev. F. J. Cochran, who in 1911 persuaded the Wilmington Conference to raise an endowment fund of \$50,000 and to place the building in charge of the board of Home Missions and Church Extension to insure its preservation for all time.

The building, open on weekends along with an amazing little museum next to it, is a popular stopping place for tourists.

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# A Drop In A Bucket

At Annual Conference in June, Conference Youth Director Shane Hinderliter said that next year's Conference Youth Rally in Ocean City, Maryland, would be emphasizing mission. One of the projects that the youth will undertake is the assembly of cleaning buckets for UMCOR. Each bucket will contain supplies needed to clean up after a disaster (e.g. bleach, scouring pads, sponges, scrub brush, etc.). Each church represented at Annual Conference was asked to pledge a specific number of items for the buckets. I pledged our church to supply 200 bottles of bleach (24-32 oz.) and 1000 sponges. We have until sometime in November to accomplish this goal. Starting in September, we will start a Drop in the Bucket campaign. If each of us donates a minimum of \$5.00 from now until November, we will reach the goal. I will contact local stores to buy the bleach and sponges in bulk so that we can maximize our contributions. Each week look for the bucket and drop in your contribution to help people who have experienced a disaster.
