- 1) The summer feeding program with the Food Bank of Delaware We need several servants to help us make sure that kids in the neighborhood have access to nutritious meals while school is out for the summer. There is minimal food preparation required, and it will be a great opportunity to interact with the kids from the community.
- 2) Free Lunch Fridays at Peniel UMC. We always are looking for talented chefs to whip up a large batch of soup to be served on Fridays from 11 AM-1 PM. You can cook on Friday mornings in Peniel's kitchen or make the soup ahead of time to be reheated for lunch. RPUMC usually provides soup about once a month. June 3 is the next scheduled time for us to provide soup.
- 3) **Home repair ministry** Richardson Park Community Action Program (CAP) has been collecting the names of individuals who have homes that are in need of minor repairs. Would you be willing to help make a difference in the lives of someone in our own community by serving them?
- 4) **Volunteer at CAP -** There is always a need for volunteers over at the CAP house. If you would be interested in volunteering, please contact me or the CAP house directly at 428-1247.

Opportunities to serve abound! What are you going to try this summer to take the love of Christ out into our world?

Laity Enlightenment

A few months ago, my oldest brother, Wayne, eagerly reminded me that this year was a milestone year in my life. He's right, of course; I celebrated my 50th birthday on April 23, 2011. That's a half of a Century! WOW!! Immediately, when my brother reminded me of my age, I felt compelled to reflect on my life a bit. I decided, like most people I suppose, that "if I knew then what I know now" I may have done things a little differently. But I have no regrets and there really is no reason to dwell on the past.

Time is the thing that most affects me about turning 50. The realization that more than half my life is most probably over is taking some getting used to. It feels like every year goes by faster than the one before. My father and I developed a theory about this phenomenon. Let me try to explain it. When we are one year of age, a single day represents $1/365^{th}$ of our lives. When we have lived 50 years, a day is now $1/18,250^{th}$ of our life. At 75, each day is an even smaller portion of our total days on this earth. So each day is a smaller block of time out of each year, every year, as we get older. This makes the days, and years, seem shorter and shorter. It's an interesting concept, isn't it?

No matter how you try to rationalize it, there never seems to be enough time. The important question is: How do I want to spend the rest of my time on this earth? The Bible is our guide. It is the instruction manual to teach us what we need to know to live our lives in a way that is pleasing to God. The Bible has many references to time but mostly it <u>is</u> a reference for <u>how to make the most of our time</u>.

Jesus' parables and teachings also instruct us on the importance of love and forgiveness, grace and mercy, prayer and repentance. Then, spelled out in Galatians 5:22, there are the seven fruits of the spirit: Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness. These are qualities that all God's children should strive to perfect. Recognizing these characteristics in others can also help us to be better Christians. Our church is full of Brothers and Sisters in Christ who are excellent examples of these traits. At the end of each day, my personal desire is to demonstrate self-improvement and spiritual growth in any or all of these areas beyond the day before.

There is a simple goodnight prayer that I remember reciting from the time I could speak and still say occasionally. My mother embroidered it on a cloth and put it in a frame which hung in my bedroom all my life. It hung in my daughter's room, too. It's a simple prayer and it seems always fitting:

Now I lay me down to sleep,
I pray thee Lord my soul to keep.
If I should die before I wake,
I pray thee Lord my soul to take.
If I should live for other days,
I pray thee Lord to quide my ways. Amen.

My birthday wish this year was also simple. I wished that God would help me to recognize all that He has called me to do in this life and that He is pleased by how I spend my time and what I accomplish in His name.
