Teachers have a tendency to quash unstructured time like a steamroller running over a watermelon. Bethany is excited because she gets to see all her friends again. Katie has already started band camp. Thus, the first day of school for her just brings extra work which, as any high school kid can tell you, is zero fun.



My role as a parent is to remind them that they never go to school alone. They carry my and Sarah’s love with them and, more importantly, Jesus is already there—ready and waiting for them. Keeping Jesus at the center of what we do and who we are makes all the difference whether we are celebrating the return of friends or mourning the loss of summer work and freedom. He is the difference between going alone and going with your best friend. Over and over Scripture promises that Christ and his love will never leave us or abandon us, not even on the first day of school.

My prayer for RPUMC this fall is that we keep Christ firmly in the center of all that we do and all that we are out in the world. That in the busyness and chaos of our lives this fall, we make sure that Christ is the reason we are busy and chaotic.


CAP'S 2011 CHOCOLATE FEST


