## We Are Family

The month of May is important every year for several reasons. The second Sunday in May (5-10-15) is Mother's Day. The last Monday in May (5-25-15) is Memorial Day, and as Christians we observe Pentecost Sunday this year on May 24. Pentecost is considered the "birthday" of the church since it was then that the Apostle Peter was moved by the Holy Spirit to begin to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ. For all of these reasons, one of the themes for May is often the Family: our own personal family (Mother's Day), our church family (Pentecost), and our family as a nation (Memorial Day).

When I first started out as a pastor, in the 1970's, I used to describe the local church as a kind of "second family" for many of us – a back-up and support system for our "nuclear" family: Mom, Dad, and 2.3 children (I never did figure how you got the .3 child). However, as the years have passed and families and the culture have changed, I have come to realize that the church may now be the "primary" family for many of us. Parents and children and grandparents no longer live "close" to each other – in several senses of the word "close." Therefore, when we have a need or a crisis in our home, it is often our

"church family" that we call on first. When someone is sick and others in the household have to work, we may rely on our "church family." When we have a birthday or some other milestone event to celebrate and our extended family is too far away to come, we celebrate with our "church family."

Likewise, on Memorial Day, when we remember those who have died in the service of our country, we remember that it often is our "church family" that comes first in times of tragedy and it is our "church family" that will still be with us when everyone else has gone back home.

## **BE HAPPY, BE HEALTHY!**

Most happy people tend to be physically active, socially outgoing, and helpful to others.

Taking part in a religious community involves socializing with others, a known antidote to the blues. And it can give you hope and a sense of meaning, which lessens the severity of depression.

The social support and interaction you get from church may also lower your levels of the hormone cortisol. Depressed people have higher levels than normal, and high cortisol may harm mental function. By reducing cortisol, church attendance may dampen depression's impact on the brain.

The fellowship you gain may even provide a buffer against the harmful effect of stress. Research suggests that emotional support from fellow church members helps prevent problems, like money worries, from harming your health. Building a closer relationship with God, on the other hand, can help you feel more optimistic and hopeful, which enables you to cope better with stressful events and illnesses.

### **VOLUNTEER WORK**

Seniors who begin volunteering score significantly better on thinking tests, are less depressed, and enjoy greater mental wellbeing and satisfaction in life. When volunteering, you meet people and expand your social network, a key to healthy aging. Volunteer work can give life a sense of meaning that keeps you going. Plus, it gives your brain a workout and the opportunity to learn new things.

You can volunteer in various ways at your church. No matter how you give of yourself, you'll get something back in health benefits. Love is something if you give it away you'll end up having more!

## **VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES AT RPUMC**

- Deliver Meals on Wheels once every six weeks to approximately 12 persons. Takes approximately one hour of your time. Some volunteers do this on their lunch hour with blessings from their employer.
- Help with church office duties: prepare bulk mailings, prepare articles for monthly newsletter.
- Assist in Sunday School: work in nursery during worship; help in kitchen with food preparation and serving at the Free Lunch Ministry on Thursdays.
- Social Activities: social activities can keep your mind sharp. The Koinonia Fellowship meets the third Friday of each month. They enjoy covered-dish dinners, game nights, picnics and trips.

## SPECIAL MOTHER'S DAY CAMPAIGN

This year on Mother's Day, May 10, RPUMC will honor our mothers and other important women in our lives by joining with United Methodists everywhere to raise money for Imagine No Malaria, a ministry of the United Methodist Church. Imagine No Malaria launched the campaign so that mothers in Africa will be able to fight malaria and see their children grow into thriving adults. Eighty-five to 90 percent of deaths from malaria are women and children under the age of five.

We are making a difference! Today a child dies every 60 seconds from malaria; just a short time ago, it was every 30 seconds. The number of deaths per year has dropped from 1 million to about 655,000. Malaria is both preventable and treatable. There is currently a plan to eliminate malaria in our lifetime. It includes bed nets, medicine and training of health workers. A bed net costs \$10 and can protect four people from mosquito bites at night when the mosquitoes feed.

If you would like to give a contribution to help this worthy cause, please make your check payable to RPUMC and specify "Imagine No Malaria" on the memo line. One hundred percent of your donation will go directly to fighting malaria.
