"'I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die." John 11:25-26

As I sat down to write this article the words of "Celebrate Jesus" by Gary Oliver popped into my head. My heart rejoiced as I sang, "Celebrate Jesus celebrate, he is risen and he lives forevermore; he is risen, come on and celebrate the resurrection of our Lord." I found this great article entitled "The Power of Easter; Now More Than Ever" and wanted to share some of it with you.

"The secular critique of the Christian belief in resurrection is that it is "pie in the sky," that it ignores reality, and that it glosses over the darkness and tragedy of life. In fact, the biblical accounts do just the opposite. That is why we observe "Good Friday" as the darkest day in history, why we drape the cross, and why we read out loud about the cowardice of the disciples, the betrayal of Judas and the unbelief of nearly every single follower who saw or heard about the empty tomb.

The Easter message is not about a God who saves us from pain and darkness, but about a God who is plotting victory in the midst of defeat, who is planting seeds in the darkness of winter and who is preparing a Technicolor palette for the painting of the blackest canvas."

The article is a great reminder to us of God's unfailing love in the midst of all the chaos in the world. We see so much going on in the world but it doesn't dim the light of our resurrected Savior. Join us as we celebrate Jesus. We will celebrate Palm Sunday on April 10th 10:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Praise God we will be celebrating Good Friday service on April 15th at Peniel UMC at 12:00 p.m. On Easter April 17th Sunrise service will be held at St James Episcopal Church at 6:00 a.m.; 10:30 a.m. service at Richardson Park and the 4:30 p.m. service will be online only.


Now - it is time for my sisters in faith assignment:

### **TECHNOLOGY TIPS**

BY JIM CHILCUTT Ways to Organize Your Desktop

Have too many windows open on your desktop? Here are a couple of tips for organizing the windows. First, lets make sure we know what the desktop is. Its that view on your monitor that you see right after you log on and before you open any apps. Sometimes after working for a while you end up with numerous windows open and you want to close them.

An easy way to close all the open windows is to move your cursor all the way to the lower right corner of the screen and click on a very narrow strip there to show the desktop. All the open apps will be minimized to the task bar on the bottom of the screen.

Another way is to move the cursor over the taskbar and right click your mouse. This will open a popup menu and one of the options is to show desktop. Click on that and all apps will minimize to the taskbar.

Any open app will have an icon on the taskbar that is underlined. Simpy click on that underlined icon to restore the app to its earlier view.

A final way to organize windows is to left click on the menu bar of the app and drag the open window to any edge or corner of the screen and drop the window. It will park where the cursor was. Make sure to place the cursor where you want to drop the window. Experiment and have fun.

Hope these tips help you with organization of your desktop.
