


#### **LEAVE OR STAY**

## **TECHNOLOGY TIPS**

Windows 11 is Coming - do some research before updating

Some of you may have noticed Microsoft is pushing an upgrade to Windows 11. Here are some simple "changes" that I found on the website below:

- You may need to buy a new computer. There
  are hardware requirements that many old
  coputers will not support. A quick way to check
  if your hardware is compatible is select
  settings/update and security. If your hardware
  is compatible, it will tell you there.
- The taskbar works differently.
- The start menu has changed.
- The search window isn't always available as it is now.
- Windows home version requires signing on to a Microsoft account. Another step toward forcing you to employ services you may or may not want.
- The action center (lower right where the date and time are located has been changed.
- Microsoft will continue to support Windows 10 for 3 years (until October 2025).

If you are satisfied with Windows 10 there is no compelling reason to upgrade.

If you do upgrade, you will have 10 days to revert back if you don't like it. As with any major system upgrade make sure you back up your critical/important files. Not all conversions will go smoothly.

#### Peter D Weaver Congo Partnership

Beginning May 29, we will start a new mission project. For many years, as I have attended Annual Conference and have heard about all the Peter D Weaver Congo Partnership has been doing for the people of the Central Congo from providing medical clinics, feeding malnourished children, providing sewing machines so the women could support themselves, funding schools and more, the one thing that has tugged at my heart was drilling wells. Wells not only supply safe drinking water, but also give the people a way to cleanse their bodies and clothing. Water borne diseases have greatly declined in communities that have a well. Before wells, women would walk miles to a water source and carry containers of unsanitary water weighing forty pounds on their heads back to their families! I'm not sure we can pay for a well (if God wants us to, God will provide), but I ask everyone to consider what our lives would be like without water and to give what we can.
