


NURSERY IS REOPENING!

TECHNOLOGY TIPS BY JIM CHILCUTT

Bad actors are constantly coming up with ways to get access to your money and personal information. Here are some ways I have heard that are going around.

- You receive a phone call from someone claiming to be calling on behalf of a loved one. Your loved one has had an accident and needs cash to get home. Please send a money order. If you get such a call do your homework and verify the location of your family member. There are a lot of variations on this but the general theme is the same.
- You are having trouble with your computer. You call the support desk and are told support will cost some amount of money and would you please provide a credit card which of course requires you to give them personal data. After working on the computer you are told they have identified the problem but they need to remote in to your computer to fix it. While this is a common practice, you should end the call immediately if you are not 100% confident of the tech. First, a reputable tech company will not ask for money up front. Next if you allow them to remote in they can scan your computer for personal data and also plant malware.

DONATIONS NEEDED





The Delaware District Board of Laity currently has 2 volunteer positions open. They are in need of a secretary and treasurer.


