# **TECHNOLOGY TIPS**

How Good is Your Password?

Last months article was about account takeover and how to protect your account. One of the ways to protect yourself is a well-constructed password. This article explains how to construct a strong password.

There are 26 characters in the English alphabet. If you have a 4-character password using just lower-case letters there exist 14,950 combinations. If you use both upper-and lower-case characters, the number of combinations goes to 270,725 which is a bigger number but still relatively easy to be generated by a program. If your password is 8-characters, the number of combinations goes up to 752,538,150 which is much harder to guess and would take longer to crack. Now if your password consisted of 24 characters the number of combinations goes to 426,384,982,032,110 (approximately).

The point is the longer the password the stronger it is. The problem comes when you try to remember and or type in a longer password. This is where the pass phrase comes to the rescue. Instead of a single long password try typing a sentence. For example, here is a sample pass phrase - "mydoghasfleas" (without quotes). Make it harder by capitalizing some letters - MyDogHasFleas. Now add some numbers - MyDogHas3599Fleas. One more sample - add some special characters - !MyDogHas3599Fleas@. A strong password that is easy to remember.

Experiment with different lengths and styles and see how creative you can be.




