

(Matthew 28:16-20; Luke 24:13-53; John 20:11-19) and then he ascended into heaven. (Acts 1:6-11)

Now, my sisters in faith, May's assignment:


- Attend our May meeting in the extension on May 14 following our worship service. This will be a short meeting - May 14th is Mother's Day!

TECHNOLOGY TIPS

What Is Account Takeover Fraud?

Account takeover fraud occurs when cybercriminals gain access to your online accounts and use them to withdraw money, make purchases or extract information they can sell or use to access your other accounts. Potential targets of account takeover fraud include social media and email accounts, as well as those you use to shop or handle bank and credit card transactions. During the pandemic, there's been an uptick in government benefits, such as unemployment payments, involved in account takeover fraud --a good example of the opportunistic thinking that drives this trend.

What can you do to reduce your risk of account takeover fraud? Following general best practices for reducing the risk of identity theft is a good place to start. Some factors may be out of your control. For example, your information may be leaked in a data breach without your knowledge or the opportunity to secure your information. You can, however, take steps to limit the ways bad actors can use your data.

- Be meticulous with passwords.
- Use multifactor authentication.
- · Safeguard your credit.







Dear Delaware District UM Churches,

New life abounds! Please spread the resurrection news below through your congregations and networks. This opportunity can help many of our members and friends clear up outstanding legal issues...See the link below for more details.

The Delaware Courts will be hosting an event called Safe Surrender on May 12, 2023 at the Leonard L. Williams Justice Center (500 N. King Street Wilmington, DE 19801). The event aims to provide a safe and less-threatening environment for individuals with active capiases or arrest warrants for non-violent misdemeanors to surrender and have their case adjudicated before a judge.

The event is not an amnesty program, but fugitives may receive "favorable consideration" from judges for participating. The event will benefit the community as former fugitives can move on with their lives, law enforcement will have fewer fugitives to apprehend, and the courts can close outstanding cases and warrants.


