

- 1. Read the Messenger for other ways to share God's blessings.


Now, my sisters in faith:

### TECHNOLOGY TIPS

To Sync Or Not To Sync

Many applications today offer the ability to sync your data among all your devices. This includes mobile devices, laptops, or any other device which connects to the internet. On the surface this seems like a good idea. It's like having a personal cloud drive following you around.

As with any good thing there are hidden issues. For example, if syncing browsers (Edge, Chrome, Safari, etc.) then your favorites will be copied to all devices which have that browser installed and synced. It will make favorites the same on both systems. It may copy some favorites, or it may delete some.

Taking the process one step further, Microsoft has added a feature called OneDrive. You log in using a personal Microsoft account and OneDrive then acts like a backup for recently edited files. The accounts are free, and anyone can set one up.

Care must be exercised when using someone else's computer (like a work computer). Once you log into your Microsoft account the computers will sync. What was on the work computer is now on yours and what was on your computer is on the work computer.

The moral of the story is to be very careful when syncing files to multiple computers. You could end up with personal or proprietary data in the wrong places.






