

We have a few important dates to remember this month.


- 1.) October 8 is our monthly meeting following the worship.

Our September meeting was held on Friday, September 8 at 2 pm at the church. We discussed "The Librarian of Burned Books" by Brianna Labuskes.


Our October meeting will be on Friday, October 13th at 2 pm at the church. We will discuss "The Only Woman In The Room" by Marie Benedict.

TECHNOLOGY TIPS

Backing Up Data Directories

Probably the most common threat to personal data is ransomware. If you get infected by ransomware all the data and files on your computer will be encrypted and inaccessible. Unless you pay the ransom, your data is gone. Your best protection is to back up your important data.

All backups have one thing in common. An external storage medium is required. The type of medium is determined by the volume of data. External storage is getting cheaper all the time and most if not all can be connected by USB. Make sure the device supports USB 3.0 which is much faster.

Excellent choices for backup are:

- Apple time machine. Its included with Apple systems. 1 terra byte storage is recommended. It can do incremental backups and has a complete history of backups.
- Windows Backup now comes with Windows. The
 destination drive can be specified through
 windows settings. Just type "Backup destination"
 in the search box to find out how to set the
 backup destination.

For installed applications the only effective method of recovery is to reinstall the application. That means you must find out where the application stores user data and back it up separately. Make sure to keep track of all the installation media, serial numbers and updates.
