#### A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

As we begin the uncharted territory of the new school year, I thought I'd reflect on learning. We are called to be life-long learners. After all, faith is not a goal to be reached, not a destination at which we ever arrive, but a journey we take that lasts us our whole life. While there may be rest stops and detours along the way, for the most part, we are called to continue traveling that path, trusting that Christ walks with us along the way. This journey of faith involves our whole self ("Love God with all your heart, your soul, your mind, and your strength"). It involves worship, prayer, and service, as we seek to experience and live out our faith. But we're also called to seek an understanding of our faith (as much as that can be attained), and that involves study. Whether we are 2 or 102, we are called to be learners, to put our brains to use for better understanding God's word and God's will for us. We can learn in several different ways.

One way we learn is for information. When we do this, we focus on facts. We delve into history and context, seeking to understand the author's objective and meaning. Learning for information is like a research project in which we are discovering knowledge about God. I love this kind of learning, but it's not the primary way God calls us to be learners. The information we learn should lead to formation. That means the information is meant to take root in our hearts and help reshape us into followers of Christ. Learning for formation helps us understand right from wrong, seek purpose and meaning, and look for how God is at work in our lives. Learning this way allows the information we gather to form our thinking and acting. While this is an important step in the journey of faith, it's not the final one. The ultimate goal of learning is transformation. As the information forms us, we are changed from who we were to who God wants us to be. Paul says in Romans, "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God-what is good and acceptable and perfect." Through our learning, we are transformed as we grow from knowing about God to knowing and being known by God.

Let's keep our kids in our prayers this fall as they go about the task of learning but let's also challenge ourselves to be the best students we can be!

#### TECHNOLOGY TIPS

Is WIFI wired or not wired?

Back in the beginning days of personal computers there was no such thing as WIFI as all computers were connected by wires. Did not matter that much as there was no internet. Machine to machine communication was largely confined to data centers using wires or sneaker net (a machine to machine connection involving the use of sneakers). Buildings were connected by communication equipment and wires. The next iteration of machine-to-machine communication was accomplished over standard telephone lines. Each computer was connected to a modem which was connected to a phone line (aka wire).

This evolved into networks. The wires became better, and the internal infrastructure became more complicated. Every location with a computer had a wired connection which led to a switch. Every floor in a building had a switch which was connected to another switch. Devices called routers determined which switch to send data to. Still a wire to every computer.

All these wires are way to complicated for the average user so ways were needed to distribute data in a less labor-intensive manner. So they figured out how to send network signals using radio. Now networking could be achieved using one wire from outside the home or business and then distribute the signal using radio. Each computer has a radio to receive and send signals in a manner which emulates wired connections. All this works great if the walls are thin and don't block signals. When this happens, a wire is added to the wireless router, which is connected to another wireless router closer to the blocked computer.

So, at the end of the day is WIFI wired or wireless? Asked another way, will wireless work without wireless. If your answer to that question is no then is wireless really wireless?




