




THE CHILDREN'S CORNER

TECHNOLOGY TIPS

Tech Tips to Simplify Your Digital Life!

1. Master Your Notifications

Are your phone and computer constantly buzzing, beeping, and demanding your attention? Notification overload is real and can significantly impact your focus.

- Take Control: Go into your device settings (both phone and computer) and review your notification preferences for each app.
- 2. The Power of a Strong Password Manager In an age of data breaches and countless online accounts, remembering unique, complex passwords for everything is impossible (and insecure!).
 - Invest in a Manager: A password manager (like LastPass, 1Password, Bitwarden, or NordPass) encrypts and stores all your login credentials securely. You only need to remember one master password.
- 3. Back Up! Back Up! Back Up! This cannot be stressed enough. Losing important photos, documents, or work due to a device failure is a nightmare.
 - Automate Cloud Backups: Most modern devices offer automatic cloud backup options for photos, contacts, and app data (iCloud, Google Photos, etc.). Make sure these are enabled.
 - External Hard Drive: For larger files and comprehensive backups, invest in an external hard drive. Schedule regular backups of your system.
- 4. Update Your Software Regularly Those "Update Available" notifications might seem annoying but are crucial for security and performance.
 - Security Patches: Updates often include critical security patches that fix vulnerabilities hackers could exploit.
 - Bug Fixes: They resolve glitches and improve the stability of your software and operating system.
 - New Features: Updates can also introduce new functionalities and improvements to experience.
 - Set it and Forget it: Where possible, enable automatic updates for your operating system, web browser, and frequently used applications.

By incorporating just a few of these tips into your routine, you can make your digital life more efficient, secure, and enjoyable. Happy tech-ing!

Recovery Bible Study


For people recovering from drug, alcohol and other addictions, the traditional church is not always the most comfortable place, But two United Methodist deaconesses are changing that with a new Life Recovery Bible Study.

On January 8, 2025, a new online group will begin that combines the best of 12-step recovery programs, the Bible, and the writing John Wesley, Methodism's founder, explained Deaconess Colleen Moskov of St. Mark's UMC in Easton.

The materials used in the group were created by Deaconess Kathy Loomis, who created curriculum for a similar Recovery Bible Study in Colorado, It is designed specifically for United Methodists in the Baltimore-Washington and Peninsula-Delaware Area to combine recovery and spirituality in meaningful and relevant ways,

The 75-minute bi-weekly sessions begin January 8th at 6:30 p,m. 
Pecometh Summer Camp Programs - June 22 - August 8, 2025

Cost: Varies by program


